

FORMER PRO KICKER FINDS THAT SUCCESS IN FOOTBALL HAS TRANSLATED TO WORK IN HIS HOMETOWN.



hen Dr. and Mrs. Wells signed up their son for soccer at 6 years old, they probably hoped it would do him some good; maybe he would meet some new friends, learn a new skill, have a good time. Little did they know that participation in the game would instill in Jason a desire for high levels of competition and teach him how to perform in stressful situations. The decision to pursue soccer laid the framework for Jason to become the hard worker he is today and undoubtedly provided a springboard for his many accomplishments.

His story begins in Lawton as a very good soccer player who was being heavily recruited by Division One universities. During his senior year at McArthur High School, Coach Plunk asked him to come out and try kicking for the football team because they needed a kicker, and the coach knew how accomplished Jason was as a soccer player. Knowing nothing about kicking for football, Jason went out and tried anyway. During practice, he turned quite a few heads, and his kicks eventually garnered enough attention that the whole field stopped practicing to watch him.

Needless to say, Jason joined the team, and his senior year, 52-yard field goal was in the history books as the longest field goal in Oklahoma playoffs.

Now he was faced with a decision with regard to college: soccer or football? He chose Furman University in Greenville, S.C., because it allowed him to play both sports. Jason joined the very small group of people who play and excel in two collegiate sports while also keeping up with the rigors of academia.

After college, Jason opted to pursue kicking in the professional arena. He worked with a kicking coach in California and was invited to compete in preseason for the Arena Football League's San Jose Sabercats, eventually beating out a UCLA All-American kicker for the job. His next move was getting drafted to the Dallas Desperados inaugural season team in 2001, and he played with them for 3 years.

In his second year with Dallas, Jason was named to the AFL first team kicker. While in Dallas, Jason became interested in the real estate business and took some courses during his last season with the Desperados.


Jason's friend and Jerry Jones' son-in-law, Shy Anderson, helped introduce him to his first job in commercial real estate with the Robert Lynn Company.
